A country is represented by its culture, its politics and notably by its food. We will talk about two dishes that are emblematic of Australia and France. For Australia, we will focus on the Damper (the traditional bread) and for France, we will focus on the Quiche Lorraine.

For baking a Damper, we need:

- 450g of flour
- 100g of butter
- $\frac{3}{4}$ of a cup of water
- Salt

Start by mixing all the ingredients and after that, we have to put the dough in the oven.

Yeah, you have finished.

Now "bon appétit".



Now we going to focus on France with its famous “Quiche Lorraine”. For that we need:

- 200g of shortcrust pastry
- 200g of bacon strip
- 3 eggs
- 20cl of thick crème fraiche
- 20cl of milk
- Nutmeg
- Salt and pepper

Once more, start by mixing all the ingredients and pour the dough in the shortcrust pastry.

Put it in the oven.

Your “Quiche Lorraine” is ready.

The Cultural CORNER



1. Legend

Jack-o'-lantern is known as a drunk miserly bad and egocentric person; he is from an Irish story. He may be the most famous character associated to Halloween.

The story narrates that, one night, he was in a pub and the Devil appeared and asked him for his mind. Jack asked him for a last drink; he accepted and became a coin of six pence. He directly put it in his purse and locked it. So, the Devil couldn't leave it.

Finally, Jack decided to set free the Devil if he gave him ten years more to live. But ten years after, he came back and Jack made him another prank in leaving him at the toll of a three.

When Jack died, his entrance to Paradise was refused but the entrance to hell too. The Devil offered him a piece of intense coal that he put in a turnip. After, he had to walk without any aims until his Judgment Day; back every Halloween night.

2. Symbol

The turnip was the originally symbol of Halloween but it became a pumpkin.

The famous character usually associated to Halloween are ghosts, ghouls, witches, vampires, bats, owls, crows, vultures, haunted houses, cemeteries, pumpkin-headed characters, black cats, spiders, goblins, zombies, mummies, skeletons, werewolves and demons.

Black and orange are the traditional colors of Halloween.

3. Event

The principal event related to Halloween is the war on to candies where children wearing horrifying suits go door-to-door and yell « Trick or treat ». The house's owner decorated their door with cobwebs and plastic skeletons.

One of the most famous dessert eaten for Halloween is the pumpkin pie. So, let's focus on what's necessary for baking one!!

We need :

- 1 can pumpkin
- 1 can EAGLE BRAND Sweetened Condensed Milk
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 unbaked pie crust



Preheat the oven to 425 degrees. Whisk the pumpkin, the sweetened condensed milk, eggs, spices and salt in medium bowl until smooth. Pour into crust. Bake 15 minutes.

Reduce the oven temperature to 350 degrees and continue baking from 35 to 40 minutes or until knife inserted 1 inch from crust comes out clean. Let it cool. Garnish as desired. Remember to store leftovers covered in refrigerator.

Culture also concerns books and literature more generally. So here is some suggestions from my students.

The Selection is a book series written by Kiera Cass. She is a 35 year old writer. She is close to her fans and very present on social networks, such as Twitter.


